

About 20 hawksbill and green sea turtles are being released into the sea by the state's Fishery Department with hopes that they will survive and thrive. under the Fisheries Act 1983.

Realising the ecological importance of the area, the department is also working to further conserve the area by proposing it be gazetted as a protected Marine Park. If realised, the waters and coral reefs of Blue Lagoon would be better protected under the Marine Park status, with prohibitions against activities such as fishing, destruction or removal of corals and aquatic life, and riding jet skis.

Through beach cleanups and informative exhibitions, and support from various groups and organisations such as Trash Hero Malaysia, Universiti Malaysia Terengganu, Oku Sentral and Tourism Malaysia, The Eco Fest Eco District event is a right step toward realising better conservation of the marine environment in Port Dickson.

The coastal town and Blue Lagoon perhaps needs no introduction as a visitor destination, but more dedicated efforts in promoting environmental awareness to protect its underwater treasures.
