Background on the Establishment of DPPSPM/SEAFDEC- MFRDMD




The establishment of the Marine Fishery Resources Development and Management Department (MFRDMD) was approved by the (SEAFDEC) Southeast Asian Fisheries Development Center Council at its Twenty-third Meeting in Bangkok in December 1990, and formalized in April 1992 as the Fourth Department of SEAFDEC. This marks an important event in the history of the Center with the appointment of its first Chief and Deputy Chief. It demonstrates the continuous commitment of SEAFDEC and its Member Countries to the changing needs and emphases in the development and management of the marine fisheries in the region.

The Government of Malaysia provided MFRDMD an area in Chendering, Kuala Terengganu with buildings, including research laboratories, research vessels, office facilities and equipment, services of professional and service staff, and an annual contribution towards the operational expenses of the Department. The building to accommodate MFRDMD was ready for occupation by the end of June 1992.

In accordance with the provisions of Article 11 of the Agreement Establishing the Center, The Government of Japan contributes towards the operational equipment, and fellowships for trainees from Member Countries and Malaysian counterpart staff of MFRDMD. This budgetary requirement is for the initial setting up of MFRDMD and the services of a Deputy Chief and a number of professional staff from Japan.

The declaration of Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZs) in the region necessitates SEAFDEC to play a more active role in assisting Member Countries to develop and manage the marine fisheries in the waters within the extended jurisdiction of their respective EEZs. This task needs to be tackled on a regional basis. With the establishment of MFRDMD, it is hoped that the regional needs and problems of coastal states, associated with the responsibility to conserve and manage the marine fisheries for sustained development, could be addressed more effectively.



Vision

The establishment of SEAFDEC-MFRDMD carries the vision to be a center of distinction for sustainable development and management of fisheries resources in the Southeast Asian region.





Chronology on the Establishment of DPPSPM/SEAFDEC-MFRDMD

1968 Malaysia is a pioneer member of SEAFDEC since its formation in 1968.



The Department of Fisheries Malaysia established a new research center at Pulau Kambing, Kuala Terengganu known as Fisheries Research Institute (FRI) East Coast Branch.

1988

An initial proposal was made by the SEAFDEC Council Director for Malaysia to set up a new SEAFDEC Department dealing with fishery resources development and management in the 21st Council Meeting on 29 Nov. – 2 Dec. 1988 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The outline of the Malaysian proposal for the fourth SEAFDEC appear is as Annex 1. The department tentatively to be named as the Marine Fishery Resources Development and Management Department (MFRDMD) and to be hosted by Malaysia. The Council agreed to establish a Technical Working Group to study the Malaysian proposal.

1989

The Councils, in the 22nd Meeting in Singapore, welcomed the proposal for setting up a new department and was informed that the Secretariat had extended invitation to the Member Countries to nominate two representatives from each Member Countries to participate in the Technical Working Group.

The Fisheries Research Institute (FRI) East Coast Branch was upgraded to the Marine Fisheries Resources Research Center (PPSIM) and was moved to Wisma Armon, Jalan Kamaruddin Kuala Terengganu.



1990

The Technical Working Group Meeting to study the Malaysian proposal on the establishment of the new SEAFDEC department was convened in Bangkok Thailand from 16-19 January 1990.

The Council at its 23rd Meeting in December 1990 in Kuala Terengganu, Malaysia, agreed to establish the Fourth Department of SEAFDEC.



PPSIM was relocated from Wisma Armon to Wisma Perikanan in Chendering (presently the office for the Trengganu State Department of Fisheries) while the new building for PPSIM was being constructed at the adjacent site.



1991

Α team of experts (Dr. Tamotsu Yonemori, Mr. Keiichi Kondo and Mr. Iwao Noguchi), was dispatched to Malaysia in August 1991, to formulate the organization of the fourth department, functions, research programs the three-year and operational plan (1992-1994). After considering the report of the Mission, the Council in the 24th Meeting held in the Philippines on 10-13 December, 1991 endorsed the report and approved the three year operational Plan MFRDMD for 1992 - 1994.





1992

PPSIM has been upgraded to DPPSPM/SEAFDEC-MFRDMD to serve as the national as well the regional center. DPPSPM is acronym for "Departemen Penyelidikan dan Pengurusan Sumber Perikanan Marin", which is administratively under the Department of Fisheries, Malaysis, and MFRDMD is stands for Marine Fishery Resources Development and Management Department which serve as the fourth department of SEAFDEC. The center first started its activities on 3rd May 1992, at its own building in Chendering. The DPPSPM is headed by a Director which is also the Chief for SEAFDEC-MFRDMD.



The first Director of DPPSPM cum the first Chief of SEAFDEC-MFRDMD was Mr. Lui Yean Pong and the first Deputy Chief of SEAFDEC-MFRDMD was Dr. Tamotsu Yonemori.

SEAFDEC-MFRDMD and SEFDEC-TD jointly launched an Interdepartmental Collaborative Research Program to evaluate the fisheries resources of the South China Seas as a basal objective in the development of sustainable fisheries. The first of the four defined survey area, covering the Gulf of Thailand and the East Coast of Peninsular Malaysia was surveyed using vessel M.V. SEAFDEC.


MFRDMD started the collection of tuna fishery statistics in the Southeast Asian region. This responsibility was transferred to MFRDMD through the FAO SEAFDEC Memorandum of Understanding signed by FAO, representing the Indo-Pacific Tuna Development and Management Programme (IPTP) and SEAFDEC on 17 June, 1996.

MFRDMD conducted the first SEAFDEC Workshop on Marine Turtle Research and Conservation in Kuala Terengganu from 15-18 January 1996.





MFRDMD published the Field Guide to Important Commercial Marine Fishes of the South China Sea, a pictorial book prepared jointly with Japanese Experts.







Aerial view of Pulau Kambing








Plate 92: Cephaloscyllium sarawakensis (Catalogue No. MSR201, holotype, mature female, 354 mm total length)
